COMPETENCY RESTORATION SERVICES

HOW DID I GET HERE?



In the hearing today, the judge decided you were “not competent.” This means the judge thinks you are not ready to move forward with your case. The judge also decided that you need help getting ready for your case and signed an order of commitment referring you to the Outpatient Competency Restoration Program (OCRCP). The OCRCP is one way you can get treatment. The other way is at one of the state hospitals.

WHAT IS OCRCP?

The OCRCP is a treatment program that allows you to live at home while receiving competency treatment in the community. Clinical and case management staff will meet with you to see if you are a good fit for the program. If so, Behavioral Specialists provide treatment two times each week, and Case Managers will meet you in your home weekly.

WHAT CAN I DO NOW?

You can make sure we can reach you. Tell the clerk and your attorney your current address and phone number, or call us when you get home.

ACCEPTANCE

Within the next week, staff from OCRCP will call you to set up a time for you to meet with a doctor and a case manager. After those meetings, the Clinical Director will decide whether you are a good fit or whether you will need to be admitted to one of the state hospitals for treatment.

OCRCP PARTICIPANTS

- Do not use drugs or alcohol
- Do no danger to community or self
- Have stable mental health
- Have reliable transportation
- Can keep stable housing
- Are motivated and have a good attitude

HOW LONG DO I NEED TO DO THIS?

The total amount of time you will be in the Program *can be* up to 9 months (for a misdemeanor) or one year (for a felony). You will be seen by a doctor, and possibly the judge, every three months to see if you are ready to continue with your case.



PROGRAM REMOVAL

If something changes while you are in the Program we might need to ask the judge to send you to the hospital. This can be for things like:

- Missing appointments
- Breaking the law
- Using drugs or alcohol
- Doing dangerous things
- Not taking medications

If we decide that you can no longer be in the Program, we will send a letter to the judge. If we are concerned for your safety or the safety of others, the judge may issue an arrest warrant and order of transport for you to be taken to the hospital.



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
